

Holy Week for Kids - Saturday

Theme: Active Waiting

2. Discuss:

What was Andy trying to invent?

Did his invention work?

He learned that he should be patient and wait for God to send the snow.

And while he waited, he worked on another invention!

3. Read Romans 8:24-25.

What kind of things do you hope for?

God wants us to be patient in waiting for those things. Just like we have to be patient and wait for Jesus to rise from the dead. His disciples had to wait 3 days. But it was worth the wait!

4. Craft

- You need paper, crayons or colored pencils, and tape.

- You will be drawing three things on the front of the paper:

1. Something you have to wait for everyday (like the bus or on line in the cafeteria).
2. On the back of the paper leave a space in the middle, and all around draw mouths with X's through them. No whining while you wait!
3. On the front of the paper, draw something you wait for anxiously. For example, waiting for the Wifi to come on, or finding out about a grade on a test.
4. On the back of the paper write "patiently and confidently" around the mouths. Keep the middle blank still!
5. On the front of the paper your third picture is something that you are waiting to happen that's going to take longer. For example, your birthday that is a few months away, or the end of the school year, or going to middle school next year.
6. Be strong and have hope that things will come! On the blank space on the back of your paper write a prayer to God about the things you are waiting for.
7. Roll the edges of your paper inward and tape them down. Make sure the mouths and prayer are on the outside.
8. You just made a pair of binoculars!

We can "look" forward to Sunday with patience and confidence that God will do what He says He will!
